I believe we have reached the stage in our progress and growth that our members should have the opportunity to enjoy life memberships. I suggest that we set Life Memberships at a figure between two hundred fifty (250) and three hundred fifty (350) dollars, and that the amount collected be placed in a special fund where the interest would be applied to graduate dues. I am certain that in the forty (40) odd years of our existence we now have at least one hundred (100) men who would express that type of faith in the continued growth and progress of our great Fraternity.
